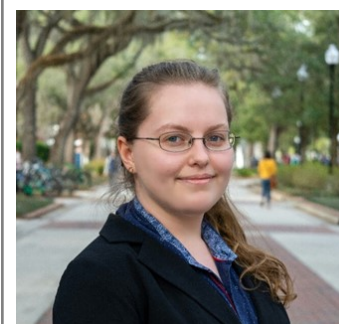

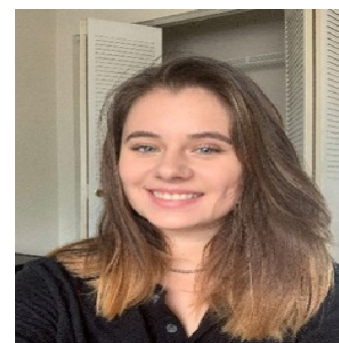
Paulina Wiktorja Kapuscinska. Junior at the University of Florida majoring in Biomedical Engineering. Born in Rzeszow, Poland.
